17 items for the KIS

- 1. Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with the standard of teaching (NSS)
- Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with their course (NSS)
- 3. Proportion of students in employment six months after completing this course (DLHE)
- 4. Professional bodies which recognise the course (Institution)
- Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with the support and guidance they received (NSS)



17 items for the KIS

Universities UK

- 6. Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with their feedback on assessment (NSS)
- Proportion of students employed in a full-time professional or managerial job six months after completing this course (DLHE)
- 8. Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with the library facilities (NSS)
- Average annual cost of accommodation (institution)
- 10. Percentage of course spent in scheduled learning and teaching (institution)
- 11. Proportion of the assessment by written or practical exam or coursework (institution)


17 items for the KIS

- 12. Average salary six months after leaving
- 13. Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with the Students' Union
- 14. Financial support available
- 15. Proportion of students at the university satisfied or very satisfied with the IT facilities






