


#### Scale of Investment

## Reflections on pooling expertise

One of the unforeseen benefits of 'research pooling' is in a name that lends itself so well to metaphors. The latest report in Research Fortnight appeared under the headline "diving in"—aptly describing my own feelings each time we embark on a new pooling project [RF 4/6/08, p2].

The purpose of a gathering at Edinburgh University in late May, which brought together around 60 research

- All institutions conducting world-leading research
- World leading research in 64 out of 65 (submitted) UoAs
- 15 per cent rated at 4\* in RAE2008 (10% in RAE2001 (5\*))
- Very low levels of '0' rated research
- Post-92 institutions and SSIs did well.
